

**PARK COUNTY SCHOOL DISTRICT #6
BOARD OF EDUCATION POLICY**

Code: AA

LEGAL STATUS

The Board of Trustees is a legal body created by the authority of statutes of the State of Wyoming as the governing body for Park County School District No. 6. Its members derive their responsibilities and powers from state law.

Board members, who are elected to four-year terms, have no authority over school affairs as individuals. They have authority, within State law, over school affairs when they serve as a legal body. No action of the Board shall be vowed unless such action shall receive the approval of the majority of the members elected. The term of office for Board members shall run for four years from 12:00 noon on the first day in December following the election.

The Board is, in practice, primarily a policy making body. The Board delegates the function of administrating the policies to an officer of the Board - the Superintendent of Schools.

Delegating the administrative function makes the Board responsible for evaluating the effectiveness of the execution of Board policies. Evaluation by the Board requires a continuous appraisal of the results of its educational policies as well as the effectiveness of the general administration.

The Board will function and act as a body of the whole. The Board may be aided by special committee appointed from time to time by the Chairperson, with the approval of the Board.
